Summary: The U.S. Mission in Brussels is seeking eligible and qualified applicants for the position of Co-CLO Coordinator.

The work schedule for this position is: Full Time (FS: 40 hours per week)

Start date: Candidate must be able to begin working within a reasonable period of time of receipt of agency authorization and/or clearances/certifications or their candidacy may end.

Supervisory Position: Yes

Duties: The Community Liaison Office Coordinator (CLO) develops and manages a comprehensive post program to maintain high morale (morale is directly affected by quality of life issues related to the Foreign Service lifestyle and post-specific environment). The CLO identifies the needs of the post

community and responds with effective programming, information and resources, and referrals. Serving as the community advocate for employees and family members, the CLO advises post management on quality of life issues, recommends solutions, and advocates effectively for employee/family friendly post policies.

Qualifications and Evaluations

Education: Completion of secondary school required.

Requirements:

EXPERIENCE: Minimum of five years of professional work experience required. Minimum of six months of supervisory experience required. The supervisory experience may be included in the 5 years of professional work experience.

JOB KNOWLEDGE: Job holder is required to learn and understand detailed information about the US Missions, agencies at post, key officers of each agency, and staffing of each agency. Good understanding of Belgian rules and norms related to the Community Liaison Office program, including Bilateral Work Agreements, local educational system and any host government procedures relating to community programs.

Evaluations:

LANGUAGE: Level III (Good Working Knowledge) English Speaking/Reading/Writing required. (This may be tested.)

SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Standard knowledge of Microsoft computer environment required; ability to draft and edit material for correspondence and publication required. Ability to demonstrate good interpersonal customer service skills required.

Qualifications: All applicants under consideration will be required to pass medical and security certifications.

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY (EEO): The U.S. Mission provides equal opportunity and fair and equitable treatment in employment to all people without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, political affiliation, marital status, or sexual orientation.

Benefits: Locally Employed Staff, including Members of Household (MOHs), working at the U.S. Mission in Brussels receive a compensation package that includes benefits such as hospitalization insurance, life insurance, and extra-legal pension.

For EFM's, benefits should be discussed with the Human Resources Office.

The pay plan is assigned at the same time of the conditional offer letter by the HR Office.

HIRING PREFERENCE SELECTION PROCESS: Applicants in the following hiring preference categories are extended a hiring preference in the order listed below. Therefore, it is essential that these applicants accurately describe their status on the application. Failure to do so may result in a determination that the applicant is not eligible for a hiring preference.

HIRING PREFERENCE ORDER:

- (1) AEFM / USEFM who is a preference-eligible U.S. Veteran*
- (2) AEFM / USEFM
- (3) FS on LWOP and CS with reemployment rights **

* IMPORTANT: Applicants who claim status as a preference-eligible U.S. Veteran must submit a copy of their most recent DD-214 (“Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty”), equivalent documentation, or certification. A “certification” is any written document from the armed forces that certifies the service member is expected to be discharged or released from active duty service in the armed forces under honorable conditions within 120 days after the certification is submitted by the applicant. The certification letter should be on letterhead of the appropriate military branch of the service and contain (1) the military service dates including the expected discharge or release date; and (2) the character of service. Acceptable documentation must be submitted in order for the preference to be given.

** This level of preference applies to all Foreign Service employees on LWOP and CS with re-employment rights back to their agency or bureau.
